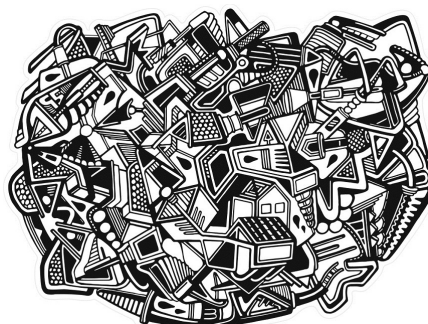
What:

For centuries maligned, mistreated and misunderstood, Gamay was outlawed by Philip the Bold in 1395. Some vigneron rebelled, hiding forbidden Gamay vines amongst 'noble' Pinot Noir. In their honour we 'release' the deliberately disruptive Gamay, bottled without appellation and without rules!

Where:

Gamay loves the granite/siliceous soils of the vineyards in the hills to the northwest of Lyon in eastern France. Grapes were hand picked deliberately early to maintain freshness. In the cellar, the grapes are vinified using traditional carbonic maceration techniques (where fermentation is started by the weight of berries in the vat, crushing those below) followed by a short cuvaison to maintain the up front, juicy fruit character.
